Successful Macmillan coffee morning



Firefighters passing out: Wheathampstead Fire Station welcomes two new recruits

Hertfordshire Fire and Rescue Service has seen its latest recruits complete their basic training and be officially welcomed into their new roles as retained firefighters. They will now be on call to deal with emergencies alongside their normal jobs, ready to respond to alerts within four minutes.

Two of the 15 new firefighters were Adrian Biddulph and Mark Dedman from Wheathampstead. They will both be posted to Wheathampstead Fire Station.



During the course the trainees worked hard to achieve high standards of skills and abilities in subjects including firecraft, breathing apparatus, fire behaviour and tactical ventilation, road traffic collision, first aid and trauma care. Their training will now continue at their individual stations where they will maintain and develop these skills.

Terry Hone, cabinet member for community safety at Herts County Council, said:

“I congratulate all the new recruits and welcome them to their new roles. They stand at the threshold of a unique career which offers them an exceptional range of opportunities and experiences. Being a retained firefighter is one of the most exciting and rewarding jobs you can do and provides a valuable service to the community.”

Retained firefighters need to live or work within four minutes of a fire station and be on standby to attend emergency incidents.

In return, Hertfordshire Fire and Rescue Service offers full training and a basic annual retainer as well as payments for call-outs to incidents. Firefighters are required to attend the Station for training with colleagues for three hours, one evening per week, for which they will be paid.

Book review:

Heartwood Arboretum - A living guide to all the trees and shrubs native to the British Isles

This 48 page booklet, produced by the Woodland Trust, is a guide to the newly planted Heartwood Arboretum, which covers 11 hectares of the Forest. It describes in some detail all sixty of the trees and shrubs native to the British Isles.


Reading through this enlightening booklet you may come across trees you have never heard of, let alone seen, such as the Strawberry Tree, Whitebeam, Wayfaring Tree and many others, all of which grow somewhere in the UK.

The booklet takes you through each of them describing the look, size, colouring and other interesting things such as how the wood is used. There are excellent photos showing the leaves, fruits, berries and sometimes the bark.

Even if you're not a tree lover, this booklet may encourage you to visit the Arboretum and see these trees and shrubs all set out in their separate beds. If you are already a tree lover, walk through the Arboretum with the booklet and, on the way back, see if you (and perhaps your children) can remember all the names.

The Scots Pine are growing well and you can imagine what they will look like in 100 years (people are living longer); the Box are protected in little box shields (very appropriate); the willows are cracking on. I was bowled over by the Cricket Bat Willow and the Broom is not for sweeping.

To find the Arboretum, walk to the crossroads in Nomansland and take the bridleway alongside Drovers Lane through the wooded section. When it opens out, go right towards the new fencing, cross the road, and enter the Arboretum by the north entrance.

- Family and relationship problems

- Employment issues - disputes, termination and discrimination

- Wills and Powers of Attorney

- Pension guidance

Aircraft Noise - Public Meeting

Wednesday 22nd November

7pm at the Memorial Hall

- Why is there so much aircraft noise at night?
- What can we do to stop aircraft overflying our houses?
- Why does the Airport want to change flight paths?

Noise problems caused by Luton Airport have been increasing. Since 2013 66% more aircraft are departing from Luton in bigger and noisier planes, making life a misery for many communities, particularly at night.

In 2015, the westerly departures flight path from the airport was changed, using a flight path technique called RNAV. These changes have caused a huge concentration of noise particularly over Sandridge and parts of Wheathampstead.

The Airport is now proposing to implement RNAV on all departure

routes. As this will affect, Wheathampstead, it's important that residents are aware of the scale of the problems and issues that surround the airport.

Wheathampstead Parish Council is hosting a meeting organised by LADACAN (Luton and District Association for the Control of Aircraft Noise). This will consider the growth of the airport, proposals to implement RNAV on other routes, the increase in night flights, and what can be done to pressure Luton Airport to reduce the impact of aircraft noise on local communities.

Wheathampstead Open Space Volunteers: Bower Heath

We returned to Bower Heath in September to continue raising the crowns of the trees around the grassland and create small glades and scalloped edges to the woodland, to improve the different habitats. Raising the crowns allows our contractor to mow closer to the woodland edge and so prevent brambles and nettles invading the acidic grassland. WOSV have been working at Bower Heath for three years and the habitat improvement is noticeable; the photos above show what a couple of hours of effort can achieve.

Bower Heath is a County Wildlife site, meaning that it is designated as being of conservation importance and is recognised in Local Authority development plans. This protects it and encourages careful management

to maintain and enhance its importance.

Bower Heath is owned and managed by our Parish Council and, like Nomansland and Marshalls Heath, it is Common Land that was probably used for communal grazing and wood collecting. Today, we are less dependent on our woods for fuel and food and the cessation of grazing and coppicing has meant woodland and scrub has encroached on to the areas of grass. Our work here helps to halt this march and preserve what is left of this important grassland.
