### 4510-16 **Apologies & Substitutions**

Apologies were received and accepted from Councillors E Habib and Haynes (personal reasons).

### 4511-16 **Public Speaking**

Mr Graham Phillips, local pharmacist, spoke of the funding cuts announced in December 2015 to pharmacies nationwide and the impact this was expected to have. He urged all to follow and support the #loveyour pharmacy campaign and to seek Parliamentary support. BBC Breakfast would feature this including interviews at Manor Pharmacy, Wheathampstead scheduled for 23 February. This item was then debated at Minute 4513-16.

Sue Camastra spoke of the St Albans' Got Talent Team 2016 planned events - an appeal across the district for community venues to hold a series of competitive events to raise money for community projects and charities. In 2016 funds were being raised for St Albans Town Hall Art Gallery and Museum. She requested free use of the Memorial Hall to promote the event. This item was debated at Minute 4514-16.

Julie Bell spoke of WDPS's plans to undertake sign cleaning on 5 March as part of the 'Clean for the Queen' campaign. The Wheathampstead and District Preservation Society also hoped to host a community tea party on 12 June and sought support from the Parish Council in terms of funding and venue use.
