In the spring of this year, a Wheathampstead station seatback sign came up for auction.

Through a crowd-funding exercise using the "Just Giving" website, the railway platform team raised enough money to place a bid of up to £1,200. Unfortunately, the sign sold for £1,500.

As part of the crowd-funding campaign, we promised that if the bid failed, any money collected would be used on the platform.


First, Terry Pankhurst made an exact replica of the original sign in wood, to be used as a casting pattern. We sent this to a foundry and had three identical replicas cast in iron. It is almost impossible to

tell these from the original but the date of "2018" has been cast in small letters to show that they are copies. Two will be displayed at the platform and the third held in reserve.

We had money left over so, again using Terry's carpentry skills, we made a station sign which we have installed at the west end of the platform close to the roundabout. We have also acquired and restored some more luggage to replace the luggage that was vandalised on the platform.

The rest of the money will be put towards maintenance costs.

We would like to thank all those who contributed and hope you feel the money is being well spent.





FOUNDATION

Nearly 300 years ago a local man, James Marshall, left his estate of houses and land to create a Charity that would support young people living in the Parish of Wheathampstead, which at that time included Harpenden. The aim was to help young people of limited financial means to enter into apprenticeships.

Today the Foundation provides financial assistance for young people with educational and career-related opportunities at school, college, university or in an apprenticeship that would otherwise be too costly.

Grants totalling about £200,000 are awarded each year to about 200 young people in Wheathampstead and Harpenden to help with the cost of such areas as travel, course fees, accommodation at University, books and equipment, school trips and school uniform. Most applicants are aged between 16 and 24 but the Foundation can support younger children.



A ringing success

One of the exciting things about being a bell-ringer is that you can turn up at almost any church or cathedral anywhere in the world on their practice night and ring – or arrange a special time for a group to ring. On this basis a group of 17 ringers from Herts, including five of us from St Helen's, rang at 16 different towers in Ireland, including six cathedrals. The exciting bit – apart from the challenge of ringing so many different bells – is that we got to go up spiral staircases, along passages overlooking the church floor, even onto the roof in some cases, all places that almost nobody else gets to see. We had an

advance view of the new labyrinth being constructed in Christchurch Cathedral, Cork (also unusual because it has 16 bells – one of only three such towers in the world) and a close-up view of stained-glass windows in another Dublin church. It wasn't all ringing – we managed some sightseeing in Dublin too, including a trip round the Guinness exhibition.

Unfortunately, ringing is a dying art, so in this 100th anniversary of the end of World War I, there is a move to recruit 1400 new ringers countrywide, the same number as died in the war.

Developmental Language Disorder

A little-known disability

Friday 19 October was "World DLD Day". DLD stands for "Developmental Language Disorder" – a communication disability that affects approximately two children in every classroom but that few people have heard of.

Developmental Language Disorder means having significant difficulties with talking and/or understanding language but with no known cause such as hearing impairment or autism. DLD often runs in families and may occur alongside ADHD or dyslexia.

For a child or adult with DLD, there are challenges every day. Imagine being a sociable, intelligent child who struggles to join in conversations with peers. has the capacity to learn but finds it difficult to understand instructions in the classroom, express their thoughts and ideas or demonstrate their knowledge to the teacher. Unsurprisingly, these children may often present problems in the classroom with poor attention and listening or difficult behaviour. Or they may be the quiet, apparently shy ones at the back of the classroom whose struggles are missed. Recent research is showing significant links between DLD and poor educational and employment outcomes, mental health difficulties and youth offending.

"World DLD Day" aimed to build

awareness of this condition. A generation ago, few people knew anything about autism; the same could be said today of Developmental Language Disorder.

Let's get people talking about this hidden disability and build understanding of what it means so we can help those with DLD who struggle with talking and understanding and who really need a voice.

The Memorial Hall's "greatest show"!



On Sunday 7 October 2018, the Memorial Hall on Marford Road played host to a screening of The Greatest Showman, with over 120 tickets sold.

This was the first event created by the newly formed 'Community Cinema' group and the feedback was very positive. One local parent, who attended with her two children, said, "we loved the atmosphere and it was great to have it so close to home".

The group, which currently consists of five local residents with a shared love of cinema, was created to be non-profit making. The group is keen to donate any additional monies raised at each event to other community based

organisations wherever possible.

The focus is on making each showing an interactive event, with films you can sing along to, opportunities for fancy dress, associated discos and so much more. Suggestion boxes will be available at each event, so the sharing of ideas is highly encouraged.

The Community Cinema group aims to have 3-4 events a year to begin with, so keep an eye out for details of the next one.



OUR BEAUTIFUL RTVER

There are about 200 chalk streams in the world and some 160 of these are in England, including up to 16 in Hertfordshire. One of these, the Lea, flows through Wheathampstead and The Meads.

Like all chalk streams, the Lea faces threats: low flows due to drought and abstraction (where water is pumped from the ground to supply the local population), pollution from urban and agricultural sources, invasive species such as Himalayan Balsam, and manmade negative impacts such as weirs and dredging.

In February this year, volunteers completed a major project in The Meads to tackle the erosion of the river bank caused by children and dogs climbing in and out. This project was sponsored by the Wild Trout Trust and supported by the Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust (HMWT), the Environment Agency and the Parish Council. We want people to enjoy the river but we have to balance this with protecting the river as a

resource and wildlife habitat.

We have installed willow spiling along 80 metres of the river bank and created five preferred access points for children and dogs. Over the summer, these have proved very successful and are much admired.

So successful, in fact, that HMWT chose this as an example of the Trust's work to show to our local MP, Bim Afolami. On a Friday morning in October, he and senior staff from the Trust visited The Meads where Lesley Davies, Chief Executive of the Trust, described what the Trust is doing to protect the county's chalk streams and Patrick McNeill, who managed the Meads project on behalf of the Parish Council, explained the work and described how local volunteers had achieved these great results.

Worried about speeding through your village, street or neighbourhood? Now you can get actively involved by volunteering to run a Community DriveSafe scheme.

DriveSafe works differently from previous neighbourhood speed initiatives – communities will be empowered to ensure the safety of their local area by coming together and being given the means to take action themselves.

Volunteers are given speed display equipment and stand at the roadside monitoring passing vehicles. Speeding motorists are sent an advisory letter and those who speed frequently could receive a visit from a police officer.
