**10 Wheathampstead Dementia Friendly Community update**

WDFCG has recommended that the Dementia Awareness Course planned for Councillors on 20 May be postponed because of date clash with SADC's Annual meeting and subsequent unavailability. A revised date is being arranged.

**11 Nomansland Nature Quest request from Beech Hyde**

The Nomansland Nature Quest evolved from a grant application in 2012-13, a joint application with Sandridge Parish Council utilising Nomansland Common as a resource for young people. Local schools and youth organisations were encouraged to participate. Over time both St Helen's and Beech Hyde Schools took part once, but have not sought to participate since. Cllr Newton-Davies Sandridge PC has actively supported this initiative from the beginning received a request April 2015 from Beech Hyde. Each activity day attracts costs to include supervisor/trainer costs, toilet provision, school children's travel etc. The £2,000 budget for 2014-5 was unspent but carried forward to reserves.
