More Than Just a Name

War Memorial Project. by Terry Pankhurst.

It's been four years now since my wife and I embarked on what we thought was going to be a few months' work listing and researching the soldiers remembered on the Wheathampstead War Memorial for both World Wars. It has proved to be a long, complex, but interesting project. Our research revealed many errors on the war memorial and other names missing. From the 96 names we started with we ended up with 106 names, one of which turned out to be a woman. The names were collected from the Roll of Honour, St. Peters Church at Gustard Wood and the now demolished Folly Methodist Chapel. We had the names, now we wanted "more than just a name." This became the name of our project and the title of our book. We wanted pictures, details of their lives, and we needed to understand the impact that their deaths would have had on the wife or family left behind. For the First World War we were amazed at just how many families were related to each other. Many different families would have mourned the loss of just one soldier.



At the start we had no thoughts of our research being part of the First World War commemorations. As time progressed we were caught up in the Hertfordshire University Heritage Hub and their efforts to get history groups thinking about the coming centenary. As we were years ahead of these new groups our project was displayed to show how it could be done.

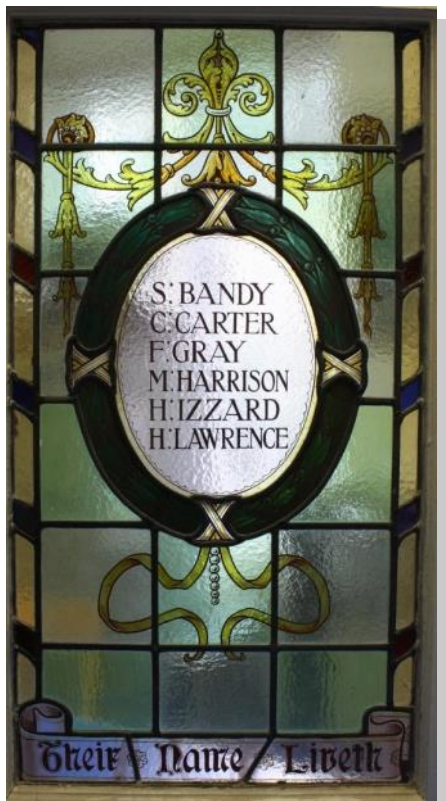
In order to do justice to any book we wrote, we felt we needed a more professional writer. We enlisted the help from a friend, Roy Markland, a retired journalist to help write the text. We already have a reference book published, "Details of the Fallen 1914-1918", giving all the details we

found for the soldiers of World War One. The story book "More Than Just a Name" is now printed and is a permanent record of how our village heroes of both wars helped to preserve the freedoms that we now take for granted and includes 243 pages with colour pictures, price £15 and available on 832817 or email at terence.pankhurst@btopenworld.com.

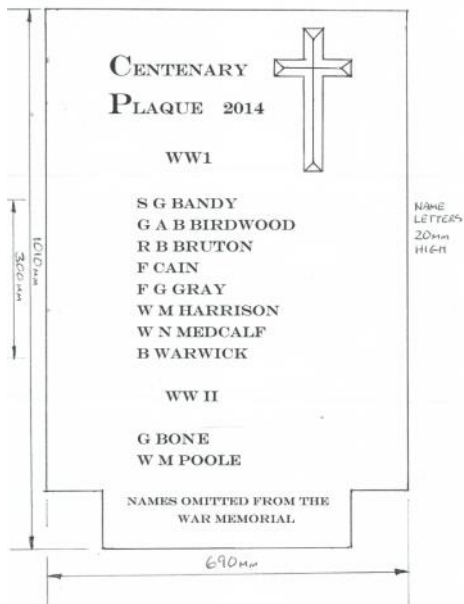

COMMUNITY FINANCE: ST ALBANS CREDIT UNION

OPENS IN WHEATHAMPSTEAD



Credit Unions are local, cooperative financial services institutions offering savings and loans within the community. Each Credit Union is owned and controlled by its members, for its members: there are no shareholders to take a profit and drive up costs. Credit Unions are rooted in their local communities and are largely staffed by volunteers.

Loans from your local Credit Union are simple, low-cost and flexible; and they are free from the exploitation and expense of payday loans and other high risk alternatives. Credit Union loans can even be used to consolidate and repay other, more expensive, forms of borrowing.

Saving accounts are easy to operate with no notice required for withdrawals. Junior saver accounts (under 16) currently pay a very favourable 2% per annum interest. All members' savings are protected by the government's Financial Services Compensation Scheme.

Despite recent concerns about payday lending and other high-cost credit, the UK trails behind other countries in taking advantage of the community finance offered by Credit Unions. In the USA and Canada, around 43% of the population use a Credit Union. In Ireland, the figure is over 70%.

The St Albans District Credit Union has been running for twelve years, with many savers and borrowers from around our local area.

Previously, it has been necessary to travel to St Albans or Harpenden in order to visit a branch of the Credit Union. Now, it will be possible to access all Credit Union services from Wheathampstead itself, as a branch opens in St Helen's Church, every Tuesday morning from 9th September, 10am until 12noon. Why not pop in, have a coffee and pick up a leaflet?

The St Albans District Credit Union is authorised by the Prudential Regulation Authority and regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority and the Prudential Regulation Authority (FRN 213794).

News from the riverbed



On a lovely sunny day in July, scores of children spent several happy hours in the river in The Meads collecting and identifying a variety of “river monsters”.

The event was organised by the Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust and managed by their Living Rivers Officer, Charlie Bell.

The children were shown how to collect a sample of the mini-beasts that live under the silt and gravel in the riverbed and then how to identify what they had found. Using the same equipment as is used by the experts from the Trust and the Environment Agency, the children found the larvae of mayfly, olives, blue-winged olives and caddis flies (both cased and caseless), together with freshwater shrimps.



The presence of these invertebrates confirms that our river is clean and healthy.
